What an exciting year in Stonebridge! Over the past year we have had a great turn out for meetings and gatherings. Neighbors are involved in their community more now than the past 5 years. We understand in our busy lives it's hard to make meetings and events in the neighborhood. That makes it even more special that more and more are taking part and support Stonebridge activities. To strengthen our community, it is important we all pull together and follow the covenants and codes of Jefferson Parish and SPOA. We continue to have boats, RVs and trailers parked at several homes throughout the neighborhood. These are code violations. Please be neighborly and not park on the street after 10pm and until 6am. Several driveways have been blocked and it was difficult for neighbors to back out of their driveways.

Due to concern from neighbors, we have increased the hours of the guards on the weekends. This will continue if we can stay within the budget for 2019. The costs of the mandated audits have increased so we will have to adjust to reflect the new costs for 2019. During 2018, we have replaced several cameras in the neighborhood that were broken and outdated. In 2019, we will continue this process within the limits of the funds available.

We encourage all residents to attend the SPOA and SNIBD meetings to have the most up to date information available to the neighbors at the time of the meetings. The SPOA monthly meetings address violations, security, maintenance to the guard shacks and current issues. SNIBD monthly meetings are about the golf club, future recreation and amenities such as pool and tennis and banquet facility.

## Commending One of Our Own

Thank you for being members of the Stonebridge Property Owners Association and for choosing to live in our Stonebridge community. Our neighborhood is one of the safest, if not the safest, on the West Bank of Jefferson Parish. This is a testimony to the many fine people of Stonebridge who live and raise their families in our neighborhood investing in its future and the quality of life we enjoy. It is also a testimony to the persons who work in our security details and who staff our guard houses day in and day out. This is especially the time of year, neighbors thank neighbors and extend greetings of the season to one another and our guests. To that end, we would like to share a special message with you.

Undoubtedly, many of you heard of the senseless tragedy which happened this summer near our Harvey Security Guard House off of Manhattan Boulevard at the entrance to our neighborhood. I take the opportunity today in this president's message to especially commend one of our own, the Stonebridge Security Officer Jane French.

Ms. French was on duty at the Harvey Guard House when she witnessed a domestic disturbance. In that situation, a driver of a vehicle was shot and mortally wounded. Without hesitation, Ms. French responded to provide aid to the victim first helping to escort children in the vehicle from the car to the guard house. She then attempted to render first aid to the victim while awaiting the 9-1-1- first responders. Ms. French also removed an infant from a car seat in the vehicle all the while noting the male offender's presence and perilous situation.

The Jefferson Parish Sheriff's Office took the male suspect into custody. Unfortunately, the female victim passed away from her injuries. While something of this grave nature is rare in or near our neighborhood, I am proud to commend Officer French, our security guard, for her bravery and prompt response to a grave emergency. Ms. French secured the children of the vehicle in a safer location and maintained her composure while risking her life in the face of an armed perpetrator.

We are very proud of Ms. French and her service. Please join us, the SPOA Board of Directors, in thanking and commending Ms. French, once again, for her exemplary response in the face of danger.

I also take the time today to thank you our neighbors for your support this year for the SPOA, our collective mission of service and our community. In this issue of the SPOA Security Newsletter, please find a guest letter from Ancil Taylor, Chairman of the SNIBD Board of Commissioners. Our awareness of happenings in our neighborhood and community helps contribute to the quality of life we enjoy in Stonebridge. As we approach 2019, we encourage you to attend SPOA and SNIBD meetings when possible. 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## From the Desk of Sheriff Joseph Lopinto:

In 2017, Jefferson Parish recorded the lowest crime statistics in the 43-year-history of tracking the numbers. So far in 2018, we are on pace to reduce those numbers by an additional 10%. Jefferson Parish is as safe now as it has ever been, and Stonebridge is among the safest areas within the parish. That does not mean we are going to relax.

JPSO deputies are on duty 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, and are always only a phone call away. We make every effort to solve crimes quickly and efficiently in hopes of preventing the same individuals from victimizing multiple people. If you see something suspicious or out of place, please do not hesitate to call us. No one knows neighborhoods better than the people living in them, and vigilant community members who are willing to partner with us in preventing crime are vital to our success.

Recently we have received a number of calls about different scams that are being used to victimize people over the telephone. While many people are able to immediately recognize the calls as scams, some do not. Several Jefferson Parish residents have fallen victim, and almost all were our most vulnerable to financial scams, senior citizens. We are working in concert with our federal law enforcement partners to do make these perpetrators answer for their crimes, but at the same time we are working at prevention. Scams of this sort are difficult to solve because of the technology used, but often the easiest to prevent. Talk to your elderly family members and neighbors and let them know -- no legitimate company is going to tell you to pay a bill in gift cards. Make sure they know not to give out personal information over the phone, and to ensure the business calling is actually one they have a relationship. Finally, no government agency is ever going to try to make you pay fines or fees over the phone using gift cards, prepaid money cards, or iTunes cards. Making sure our family and friends are aware of these schemes is the best way to ensure that they do not suffer any financial losses.

To help with educating the community about these and other prevalent scams, the JPSO regularly hosts Financial Scam Seminars on both sides of the river. ## Guest Greeting from SNIBD Chairman

Merry Christmas and Happy Holidays from your Stonebridge Neighborhood Improvement and Beautification District, SNIBD Commissioners. We are very excited about the opportunity we have been presented to define the future of the Stonebridge Community. For decades, Stonebridge has been setting the trend and blazing paths to safer communities while creating a foundation for safeguarding our neighborhood property values. Most recently, Stonebridge wisely chose to take control of a significant asset that winds its way through our community. This action ensures that our neighborhood will have significant input to determine the fate and success of our future.

In April of this year, SNIBD acquired the property and assets associated with the Stonebridge Golf Club of New Orleans. In August, after an extensive Request for Proposal process, we contracted with Touchstone Golf of Austin, Texas, to manage our facility. In September, Touchstone Golf placed Mr. Bryan Easley as the General Manager and with his extensive experience, he hit the ground running supported by his senior team leaders, Mr. Jesse Stapler, Greens Superintendent, and Mrs. Carina Zermeno, Food and Beverage Director.

In October, we engaged Albert Architecture to work with our Planning Advisory Teams, aka PAT, and Touchstone Golf to develop a rehabilitation plan for our new Stonebridge Community Center. In November, we received the required permits and documents to begin food service in our facility. As the plans are developed and they mature, Commissioner George Rey, leading our Architecture Planning Team, will present their recommendations to the SNIBD Board of Commissioners in early 2019.

Concurrently, as these initiatives are underway, you should see some changes occurring around the facility. Despite the record setting rainfall that has befallen our property since September, we have noticed remarkable improvement in many areas on the golf course. Mr. Easley and Mr. Stapler along with their crew are committed to restoring the Harvey nine to a condition comparable to what we have in the other eighteen holes. We are confident that by the end of our next growing season, the Harvey nine will have been restored. As we move through the winter months, we will see some additional improvement to all of the golf course in preparation for this spring's playing season. New golf carts have been delivered providing a much more enjoyable experience for our golfers. To protect these new golf carts, golf carts paths around the golf course have been repaired or replaced.

New golf course maintenance equipment has been purchased and delivered. Some of this equipment is intended to simply improve the aesthetics around the 189 acres within the community. A renewed focus on pond maintenance is in place, despite the overwhelming challenges we have endured with the excessive precipitation. Along with these improvements, we have instituted a new preferred golf membership for all our District residents. Proof of residency is required to obtain this preferred rate. Jefferson Parish Parks and Recreation Department is working with SNIBD to restore the special gated entrance to our Community Center from Harvey Boulevard. This entrance will be available for use during special events at our Center. It will be opened and monitored only during special events to ensure the integrity of our Security District. Landscaping and lighting along the oak tree lined drive should produce a very attractive entrance for our Community Center.

Our community has come together in a very special way to work toward maintaining our reputation as one of the most enviable places to make a home in the metropolitan area. We have accomplished much and we have so much more to do. If you are currently involved, we thank you for your participation. # Message from Councilman Ricky Templet

Friends,

As we approach a new year, the progress we have seen on the Westbank in 2018 gives us much hope for the future of our community. Reflecting on the progress we have seen over this past year, please find below an update of some of the great developments that have taken place on the Westbank in 2018.

On May 19<sup>th</sup>, we held a ribbon cutting and grand opening at Parc Des Familles for the new “state-of-the-art” Disc Golf Course. The grand opening included a small presentation by course designers from Houck Design, two live bands, various food booths, and a competitive tournament that brought in players from several states. This new Disc Golf Course will add to the current walking trail, picnic shelters, and vast green space. As we look ahead, we have some exciting news on just how much greater Parc Des Familles will become by the summer of 2019. We will be adding a new splash park and a new dog park to this Crown Gem of Jefferson Parish. If you haven’t already visited the park, please check out all the amenities on this beautiful acreage.

In regards to infrastructure improvements, on Harvey Blvd. (Peters Rd. to Manhattan Blvd.), newly revised ‘right-of-way’ maps which are intended to accommodate a change to the new Entergy substation have been forwarded to DOTD for review and approval. Once approved, the ‘right-of-way’ can be completed, and the Parish can move forward to finalize all plans with Entergy to relocate their facilities to accommodate the project.

Estimated schedule (Pending DOTD approval):

- >Approval by DOTD right-of-way maps (January 2019)
- >Approval of Entergy Utility Relocation Agreement (June 2019)
- >Approval of Entergy Facilities (July 2019- July 2020)
- >Project Bid (October 2020 to Feb. 2021)
- >Begin Construction (March 2021)

Finally, in terms of economic development, exciting news has recently been released about the former Avondale Shipyard. In this development, the former facility has been sold to HRE New Orleans, a partnership of T. Parker Host Inc. and Hilco Global. It will be converted into a multi-modal private terminal along the Mississippi river and could create approximately 2000 to 5000 new jobs located on the West Bank.

These are just a few examples of the progress that has taken place on the Westbank of Jefferson parish over the past year. Many more projects have been completed, businesses have opened and schools have been built or renovated. We look forward to working towards more progress for stone bridge, the Westbank, and Jefferson Parish in 2019.

## Winter Safety - Carbon Monoxide Poisoning Prevention

### Check Smoke Detectors and Carbon Monoxide Monitors

Mark Burrows, Certified Hyperbaric Technician, is a 13-year resident of Stonebridge Subdivision. Here he is featured in the Hyperbaric Chamber at West Jefferson Medical Center.

Mark Burrows and the West Jefferson Medical Center Hyperbaric Department remind our community of safety matters and carbon monoxide poisoning prevention. If you have not done so this year, it's time to change your smoke detector and carbon monoxide monitor batteries. This is often the season when we run our heater, fireplaces, and sometimes generators. Industry experts estimate 50% of deaths caused by carbon monoxide poisoning could have been prevented by properly functioning monitors and proper procedures. The most common causes of carbon monoxide poison related deaths deal with this. Further, always run a generator in a VERY well ventilated area following manufacturer's instructions. Improper generator use can result in death. Discuss this lifesaving topic with others in your family.

Nausea, headache, and vomiting are some of the symptoms associated with this poisoning. Carbon monoxide poisoning is a life threatening emergency and merits calling 9-1-1.

Hyperbarics is often recommended for patients with acute carbon monoxide poisoning. For more information, call the Hyperbaric Department at WJMC (504) 349-6558 or speak to your health provider.

## **Club Needs Our Help – Special Message from the GM**

Stonebridge residents,

We have been through extended periods of rain over the last few months. The property lines which boarder the golf course become saturated with water during these type situations. Often, these areas are the last to dry on the golf course, as water drains down from the homeowner side of the property line, making mowing and repairs difficult.

We respectfully ask that if any work needs to be done on your property and you would like to access your property through the golf course, that you send a written request to the golf course superintendent. He will determine whether or not using the course for access will adversely impact the course and work progress. If permission is granted to use the golf course for access, the following procedures must be adhered to:

1. Submit written request or email to the GM ([bryan@golfstonebridge.com](mailto:bryan@golfstonebridge.com)) for review prior to any work.
2. List starting date and duration of work in written request.
3. Schedule a meeting with the superintendent to discuss routings and the type of work being done.
4. Workers must check in with the pro-shop on each day work is to be done. At this time, the superintendent will determine if access is applicable based on weather conditions and other circumstances.

Your cooperation will help us provide you with a first class golf course and associated course properties and will help us to further protect the safety of our workers and neighbors.

## Message from Councilman at Large Chris Roberts

Please continue to remind everyone to be diligent in preparation efforts and be mindful of keeping catch basins clear of debris whenever possible. In the event of a storm threat or all hazard conditions please visit our parish website at [www.jeffparish.net](http://www.jeffparish.net) for announcements. Any questions or special need requests can be directed to the Jefferson Parish Emergency Management Department at 349-5360.

Storm proofing of both Hero and Planters Pump Stations along with Whitney/Barataria Pump Stations are complete. This ensures quick operation of pump stations during storm events. Through the SELA program, USACE and JP improved the Trapp Canal between Bayou Fatima and Bayou Barataria, approximately 5,000 linear feet is within Stonebridge. The improved canal has a rock bottom with vinyl sheet piling and concrete slope paving on the side. This work widened and stabilized the banks. Work began in September 2012 and was completed in June 2017. Project construction cost for the entire project was \$20.6 million.

Quality of life has been an important issue in which we have been focusing our efforts as a parish government. Jefferson Parish continues to hold property owners accountable through our Property Maintenance Office led by Director Catherine Toppel. From an economic development standpoint, the south end of Manhattan has recently seen some new growth with the addition of several national brands opening in the long vacant Superstore site. We hope to continue to see such brands investing in the Westbank as we continue to work very closely with JEDCO, our economic development arm, on several projects. In the age of increasing internet sales we would like to remind you to keep shopping local whenever possible in order to keep our commercial corridors thriving and attract new businesses.

We are proud to announce the recent opening of the New Jefferson Parish West Bank Animal Shelter. The new shelter located at Lapalco and Peters Rd. is nearly 10 times the size of its old building, growing from roughly 3,000 square feet to over 30,000 square feet. Designed by architects Burgdahl and Graves with the Koret Shelter Medicine Program at the University of California at Davis, the new shelter was built by Gibbs Construction for a cost of \$12M. Upgrades include much larger kennel spaces for the animals, upgraded veterinary care equipment, and greenspace outside that will eventually serve as a dog park. One goal of this facility is to house more animals for adoption. This facility will hold up to 400 animals which is double the capacity of the old shelter.

## Stonebridge Garden Club Awards

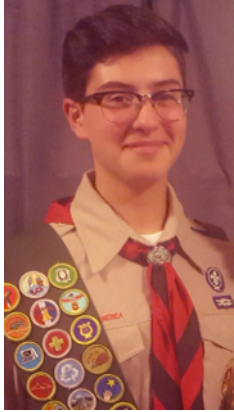

## **Congratulations to New Eagle Scout in Stonebridge**

We were pleased to learn of a new Eagle Scout in our midst and asked him to tell us about himself and his honor.

Meet William LaCaze:

Hello, my name is William LaCaze and I have recently achieved the rank of Eagle Scout. I am a sophomore at De La Salle High School. I have been a member of my troop since first grade. In scouting, every scout must go through a process to achieve each rank along the way to the Eagle rank. It is a lot of fun along the way, but also requires hard work and a dedication to reach your goal.

I am one of three remaining scouts in my troop, all achieving our Eagle Scout rank this year. The final steps required for the Eagle Rank is choosing, planning, and implementing a project for the community. My project consisted of building 5 gardening tables for the Audubon Louisiana Nature Center's new greenhouse in New Orleans East. There are 250 hours invested in this project, from the minute I decided on a project, to planning and receiving the approval to implementing the building of the tables (including designing the plans to build to meet the Nature Center's needs) and final delivery. Some of the wood used to build the tables are from park benches we disassembled. I was excited to get it over with and gosh, I am sure glad I did. It is an accomplishment I will remember forever.

My troop's scoutmaster told me that when I complete my entire scouting journey that the trail never really ends. Throughout my life, I will be living out what I have been taught through my scouting experience. It is a true honor for me, as one of the last Boy Scouts of America, to make the Eagle Scout pledge.
